PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

As I write this column, the clinic/ concert of the ATSSB All-State Band that we have all been planning and working to bring into existence is less than three weeks off. Region and Area tryouts have been completed, for the most part without incident, the programs are at the print shop and the last minute details for the convention are being put in place. The concert will be held at 12:00 noon on Saturday, February 8, in the Scottish Rite Auditorium and I hope that each of you, whether or not you have students involved this year, will be in attendance. Also, feel free to bring guests as there will be no admission charge and badges are not required.

If you do have students involved, I encourage you to assist them in the preparation of the seating tryout music. The program which the band will play in an ambitious one for this, our first year, and your students will have a much more satisfying experience if they are prepared.

There will a general meeting of the ATSSB membership at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, February 6 in the Scottish Rite Banquet Hall. The agenda will include a discussion of Region and State officer elections which will be coming up this spring as well as some proposed constitutional changes. Your input and participation in this meeting is solicited.

I urge each of you to attend the TMEA Band Division meeting at 11:00 a.m. on Friday (CC Fiesta Room) as well as the two TMEA General Sessions at 9:00 a.m. Friday and 9:00 a.m. Saturday. Election of the new TMEA State Band Division Vice-President (to replace

FrankCoachman) will be held during the Band Division Business Meeting. This election could have an important bearing on the relationship between ATSSB and TMEA for the next several years. Three candidates have announced for the position. Two of them have been non-committal on small school issues. One, Don Hauna, of Denton High Schoolwho you may remember spoke very forcefully against the small school All-State Band last spring during the TMEA Band Division Business Meeting-called me last week to say that he has re-thought the matter since we last spoke and has had a change of heart. He said the old argument that here was not enough space on the convention program or enough rehearsal and hotel space just was not true. Hepointed out that TMEA has added an additional college band to the program this year, and ATSSB has show that rehearsal and hotel space can be had.

Don assured me that, if he is elected, he plans to have a truly representational committee again study the issue - this time with the positive purpose of bringing the A-AA-AAA All-State Band within the TMEA convention. As Don said in his column, he hopes that he "...can belp mend relationships in order that a unified band division can determine what is in the best interest of all our students and TMEA". ATSSB members have an interest in electing a TMEA Band Division Vice-President who is with us on this issue.

I again want to urge each of you to maintain your TMEA membership and be present at both the Band Division Business meetings to register your vote for Band Division Vice-President, and at the TMEA General Sessions to vote for the new TMEA President. ATSSB members can make a difference if we use our vote to elect TMEA officers who will listen to and be responsive to small school interests.
