# Agenda for Fall ATSSB Region Meeting 08/11/2018

- I. Everyone, please, fill out an information form including all information. Be sure to list the best time to call and whether you mind your cell phone being listed on the region directory available on our website. If you have a Band website, feel free to write that at the bottom.
- II. All-Region/State reminders:
  - A. All contest deadlines will be 14 days prior to the audition
  - B. The late and final online student entry will be 7 days prior to the day of audition.
  - C. Corrections to an existing student may be made between 13 and 7 days prior to the audition without penalty, but any student entry added less than 14 days but more than 7 days prior to the contest will result in an additional 100% student late fee.
  - D. Entries begun less than 14 days but more than 7 days prior to the contest will be assessed a 100% additional student late fee charge.
  - E. A CAMPUS entry created less than 14 days prior to the contest will be subject to the **TMEA Grievance Process**.
  - F. Directors will be allowed to add or change student entries the day of the audition if region rules allow it. A 100% additional student late fee will be assessed.
  - G. All fees must be paid prior to the start of the auditions.
  - H. Remember Do NOT delete DNAs you may OMIT them, but do not DELETE them. TMEA needs the data.
  - I. Please note that the TMEA online entry process includes a 3A and 4A All-State Track (all students in Class 1A and 2A and 3A are automatically in the 3A Track and all students in Class 4A are automatically in the 4A Track unless they submit a Track Selection with their initial entry selecting another track or TMEA 5A or 6A Track).

- J. Be aware of housing procedures at All-State (Hyatt Regency) and that students must bring a wire stand to state.
- K. Note that at All-State Chair auditions, no electronic devices shall be allowed in the audition room other than tuners and metronomes (no cell phones or mp3 players or iPods if found, these will be taken up until after auditions); however, students may use electronic media in lieu of printed music (a book is still provided on the stand for student use) so long as the media does not conflict with the existing rules governing electronic devices as listed above.
- L. OPS entry deadline May 20 (see OPS guidelines or March Newsletter OPS Column).

#### IV. Rules:

- A. Eligibility student must be eligible to tryout for any of the organizations, and they must be eligible for the clinic/concert
- B. Instrumentation accepted per band This is set and in the Region Rules & Procedures on the website

## C. Judging requirements if entering students - every director from that school is expected to be at the audition or have a proxy in their place. Please, let the Region Coordinator know of this in advance.

- V. Reminder: there is a rule that no pictures may be taken nor any audio or video recordings made in the room(s) where judges' scores are displayed for directors to check.
- VI. Reminder: in the jazz audition, when recordings are made for advancing to Area, pause between each selection and only use the script to be read by the recording monitor or engineer stating the instrument, the student name and school at the end of each recording; also to use CD given to you by Brian Donnell that has the accompaniment tracks only so as to minimize disqualifications.
- VII. State Officer Nomination (Class 1C and 3A Representatives to the State Board and President-Elect this year - does not need to be from your region). Last Spring, Matt Knight was nominated by Region 1 for ATSSB President-Elect. (*Read email from Anna Jo, and refer to Matt's nomination request.*) Region 16 nominated Matt in their region meeting. Would our region consider nominating Matt, too. Any other nominations?

# NOMINATION REQUEST

My name is Matt Knight. I am currently the ATSSB Region Coordinator for Region 16. I am running for the office of ATSSB President-Elect, and I would like your nomination then your vote. I have been at Abernathy High School for 25 years and am beginning my 26<sup>th</sup>. A list of credentials is not as important to me as the two things I most believe. First, I believe that every child deserves a chance. Sometimes that chance, that opportunity, comes in the form of a second chance. I have worked throughout my career to give children the opportunity to grow into who they are meant to become. Perhaps I have looked too long and hard to find the good, but I truly believe it is there, and the child has to be given every possibility to find that good within himself. As this applies to our organization, I have worked relentlessly to make sure our students have many different opportunities to audition, perform, and participate. I have taken each different challenge from changes in classification to shifts in our region and looked at it from each different viewpoint. In order to see the big picture, I have collaborated with peers. I am not afraid to ask others' opinions. I am not all-knowing. Each child is different, yet kids are kids. They will learn and grow. They need the best opportunity in which to do just that. I want to continue to work to provide students opportunities through performance, participation, and scholarship to grow to the best contributing member of society they can be.

Examples:

- → 68% of my band students participate in solo and ensemble at the state level every year
- → Approximately 63% of the high school is in the band
- → Region 16 provides students with eight (8) all-region band opportunities
- Our all-region process just underwent a restructuring to accommodate 4a students who were not being afforded equal opportunities to audition and participate

Second, I believe in work-ethic. My longevity at Abernathy High School has been fostered through my dedication to work until the job is done. The only way to lead is to get my hands dirty and do it by example. I work tirelessly to provide my students with the best foundation for growth through availability, open-door policy, and willingness to listen. I get to know my students and foster relationships in order to know how to best help them to reach their potential not just in the band hall but in their lives, academic and personal. This takes work. As region coordinator, I try to do the same with the schools in our region. I educate myself to their programs and try to establish opportunities and relationships based on how best to help them. I know that some directors are seasoned veterans and need the opportunity to share their wisdom. I know that some directors are new to the region or new to the profession. I try to be available to them to answer questions and help them get their feet on the ground so they can run. This takes work. There is no job too dirty for the leader to tackle from setting up the stage at all-region to picking up the pizza boxes after a 7 all-region band pizza party. My goal is to model the drive and love for this profession in every action.

It is my promise to you that I will take my intense interest in the growth of our students and my work ethic to represent the small schools in their endeavor to provide opportunities for our kids. Self-promotion is hard for me. I run not for my ego or my resume. I run because I believe in the future of our students. I believe in the small schools and the grass roots that they provide. I believe in the organization that promotes those small schools and feeds their needs. I believe in supporting and promoting the schools that do not have the same resources that the larger schools have. I believe in work, hard work, to do what is best for our kids. I believe in modeling that hard work.

It is with these principles that I ask for your nomination and then your vote. Whether you choose to cast your vote for me or for another candidate, VOTE. Go to the meeting and cast your ballot. The only way to maintain our interests is to voice our opinion. It is your opportunity to be represented in the way you best see fit.
