The Conductor: Dr. Ed Huckeby

Ed Huckeby is a Professor of Music at Northwestern State University in Alva, Oklahoma where, in addition to his music department duties, he serves as Dean of the Graduate School and Director of Educational Outreach. Prior to his appointment at Northwestern in 1976, he spent eight years teaching instrumental music in the public schools of Oklahoma where his marching, concert, and jazz bands won state and regional acclaim. His success in the public schools of Oklahoma led him into the college teaching ranks where he is internationally recognized as an outstanding music educator and composer of over 80 published works for concert and marching band. Dr. Huckeby's ability to write interesting and accessible instrumental music can be attributed to his experience at a variety of musical levels.

Dr. Huckeby's creative flair and eclectic musical interests have been displayed in a variety of styles, including pop, country and broadway vocal and instrumental arrangements, as well as original compositions in the gospel and contemporary Christian fields. His performance background is just as eclectic, having been a member of a symphony orchestra (horn), a jazz band (trumpet), and a contemporary Christian quintet (bass guitar and vocals). Huckeby's outstanding contributions to the concert and marching band literature have played an important role in the development of the

contemporary band repertoire.

Dr. Huckeby holds a bachelor's degree in music education from East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma, a master's degree in music education form the University of Oklahoma, and a doctorate in administration from Oklahoma State University. He has written music education articles for The Instrumentalist, The American Music Teacher, and The Journal of the International Horn Society. He has held memberships in Music Educators National Conference, Oklahoma Music Educators Association, Oklahoma Bandmasters Association, A.S.C.A.P., Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Phi Beta Mu, where he has served as a member of the national board of directors and state chapter president. Dr. Huckeby has been selected as an "Outstanding Young Man in America," is listed in the "International Who's Who in Music," and was inducted into the Oklahoma Bandmasters Association "Hall of Fame" in 1996.

Ed, his wife Latricia, and their daughters Angela and Amanda, make their home in Alva, Oklahoma where, in addition to his duties as a university professor and administrator, he serves as a church musician.

The Conductor: Anthony J. Maiello

Anthony J. Maiello received both his bachelor's and master's degrees in music from Ithica College in 1965 and 1967, respectively. Mr. Maiello's many professional credits include clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor with appearances throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, England, Europe, The Netherlands and The Bahamas. He conducted musical activities for the Gold Medal Ceremonies at the 1980 Olympics in Lake Placid, New York, the New York State Music Camp & Institute; has served as New York State Music Association adjudicator; clinician with Yamaha, consultant and clinician for Warner Bros. Publications, President of the International Association of Jazz Educators - New York State Chapter and as Musical Director for American Bandmasters Association and ASCAP, and holds membership in the National Band Association, College Band Directors National Association, New York State School Music Association, Virginia Music Educators Association, Virginia Jazz Service Organization, The College Music Society and The American Symphony Orchestra League.

Mr. Maiello's academic experience includes extensive teaching in the public schools. He served as Professor of Music and Chairman of Performance at the Crane School of Music, Potsdam College of SUNY, Potsdam, New York, where his duties included advanced instrumental conducting, applied clarinet, woodwind and percussion techniques; and conductor of the Crane Wind Ensemble. Under his direction, the ensembles at Crane and George Mason University have commissioned many new works, made numerous recordings and appearances statewide and at regional and national conferences in the United States and Canada. He is the author of CONDUCTING: A HANDS-ON-APPROACH and co-

author of the 21st CENTURY BAND METHOD.

Anthony Maiello travels widely presenting clinics, lectures and workshops, and guest conducting and adjudicating numerous music festivals. He is presently Professor of Music and Director of Instrumental Studies at George Mason University, Fairfax, Virginia where he conducts the Symphony Orchestra and Wind Ensemble and teaches several conducting courses.
