Bill Brent is currently the Director of the School of Creative and Performing Arts and Director of Bands at Northwestern State University of Louisiana. During his twenty- four-year tenure at Northwestern, the band program has grown from forty-eight members to more than 300 and the wind symphony has performed at the College Band Directors National Association Southern Region Conference. Under his leadership, the School of Creative and Performing Arts has been endowed with over \$2.5 million in private scholarship funds, received more than \$3 million in grants and has had two academic professorships established.

Prior to his arrival at Northwestern, Mr. Brent taught school in the Austin Independent School District in Austin, Texas. While serving as Director of Bands at McCallum High School, the band was twice named in the top five in the University Interscholastic League State Marching Contest and the symphonic band was named in the top ten in the Texas Music Educators Association honor band competition. Mr. Brent holds the Bachelor of Music Education and Master of Music degrees from the University of Texas at Austin. He is a member of the Louisiana Music Educator Association, Music Educators National Conference,

Jeff Hellmer, educator, conductor, and pianist, has enjoyed a full, vibrant career in a wide variety of musical contexts and styles. Currently serving as Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Texas at Austin, he has performed, taught, and adjudicated jazz throughout the United States as well as in Russia and Taiwan. Under his direction, the UT Jazz Orchestra recently performed at the North Sea and Montreux Jazz Festivals, won a 2005 Down Beat Student Recording Award, and appeared with jazz master Kenny Garrett. His jazz piano students have garnered impressive recognition for their creativity and individuality. He is co-author of


the textbook Jazz Theory and Practice, published by Alfred, and his compositions for jazz ensemble are available through UNC Press and Concept Music.

As a performer, Hellmer maintains an extremely active profile, appearing frequently on the central Texas scene as well as throughout the United States at venues ranging from the Litchfield Jazz Festival to the Idyllwild Arts Academy. He recently performed in Germany with Count Basie's legendary drummer Butch Miles. His most recent CD, "Peak Moments", was declared an "exciting addition to the modern jazz piano catalog" by the All Music Guide. He has appeared as a soloist or conductor with the Dallas Wind Symphony six times, in repertoire ranging from Stravinsky to Cole Porter, and has recorded with classical saxophonists Dan Goble and Harvey Pittel.

Jerry F. Junkin serves as Artistic Director and Conductor of the Dallas Wind Symphony, as well as Director of Bands and the Vincent R. and Jane D. DiNino Chair in Music at The University of Texas at Austin, where he also holds the title of University Distinguished Teaching Professor. In 2003 he was appointed Music Director and Conductor of the Hong Kong Wind Philharmonia. Professor Junkin became conductor of The University of Texas Wind Ensemble in the fall of 1988, following an appointment as Director of Bands at the University of South Florida. From 1978 to 1982, he served as Assistant Director of Bands at UT, after which he held a similar position at The University of Michigan. In addition to his responsibilities as Professor of Music and Conductor and Music Director of the UT Wind Ensemble, he serves as Head of the Conducting Division and teaches courses in conducting and wind band literature. He is a recipient of the Texas Excellence in Teaching awards, presented annually by the Ex-Student's Association. Additionally, he received the Outstanding Young Texas-Ex Award also from the same organization. In 2004, he was elected to the Academy of Distinguished Teachers at LIT and in 2004.

Distinguished Teachers at UT and in 2005 was the recipient of the UT Fine Arts Achievement Award.

Jerry Junkin became the Artistic Director and Conductor of the Dallas Wind Symphony in the fall of 1993. Performances under the direction of Mr. Junkin have won the praise of such notable musicians as John Corigliano, David Del Tredici, Gunther Schuller, Karel Husa, William Kraft, Jacob Druckman and Michael Colgrass, among many others. In February of 2005 he led the world premiere performance of Corgliano's *Circus Maximus:* Symphony No. 3, in both Austin and New York's Carnegie Hall. The New York Times named the recent release on the Reference Recordings label with Jerry Junkin and The University of Texas Wind Ensemble, *Bells for Stokowski*, one of the best classical CD's of 2004.

Mr. Junkin has led highly acclaimed concerts before the College Band Director's National Association (five times), The American Bandmaster's Association (four times), the Texas Music Educator's Association (five times), and the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles in both Manchester, England and Singapore. Maintaining an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician and lecturer, he has appeared in those capacities in forty-eight states and on five continents. In 2005 he was presented the Grainger Medallion by the International Percy Grainger Society.

Mr. Junkin has served as President of the Big XII Band Director's Association and is a member of the Board of Directors of The John Philip Sousa Foundation, Past-President of the American Bandmasters Association, and President of the College Band Directors National Association.
